Periodic Checks

You should also perform other periodic maintenance checks at least once a month regardless of how often you ride, or more often if you ride frequently.

Also, check the odometer reading against the Maintenance Schedule and perform all maintenance that is due. ▶ P. 34

Tires and wheels	Check the air pressure (≥ P. 45), examine tread for wear and damage (≥ P. 46), and check the wheels for damage.
Fluid levels	Check the engine oil level (⊇ P. 59), engine coolant level (⊇ P. 64), and brake fluid level (⊇ P. 66).
Lights	Check that the headlight, brake light, taillight, turn signals and license plate light are working properly.
Controls	Check the freeplay of the clutch lever (► P. 73), and throttle grip (► P. 76).
Drive chain	Check the slack (♠ P. 69), adjust the slack (♠ P. 70), and lubricate (♠ P. 44) as needed.
Fuses	Check that you have a full supply of spare fuses.
Nuts & bolts	Check the major nuts and bolts, and tighten as needed.
