
Spark Plugs

Spark Plug Inspection & Replacement

Refer to Safety Precautions on page 123.

- 1. Lift the cargo bed (page 81).
- 2. Remove the air cleaner outer cover (page 140).
- 3. Clean any dirt from around the spark plug base.
- 4. Disconnect the spark plug cap. Take care to avoid damaging the spark plug wire when disconnecting the cap.
- 5. Using a spark plug wrench provided in the tool kit, remove the spark plug.
- Inspect the electrode and center porcelain for deposits, corrosion, or carbon fouling. If the corrosion or deposits are heavy, replace the plug.
- 7. Make sure that a 0.04 in (1.0 mm) wire-type feeler gauge cannot be inserted between the spark plug gap. If the gauge fits in the gap, replace the plug with a new one.
